STATE OF WASHINGTON DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES PETER GOLDMARK, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC LANDS RADIO USE PERMIT AGREEMENT WITH CLALLAM COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT #3

Permit Agreement No. RUPA 16-192

This Permit Agreement is granted by the State of Washington Department of Natural Resources, Olympic Region, hereinafter referred to as the DNR, and <u>Clallam County Fire District #3</u>, hereinafter referred to as the Permittee, for the express purposes set forth in the following provisions.

The purpose of this Agreement is to authorize the Permittee to use DNR radio frequencies to facilitate communications that DNR in its licensed activities. DNR is licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to operate certain radio frequencies to facilitate forestry conservation activities. The Permittee will assist DNR in its efforts to conduct forestry activities or to respond to emergencies involving safety to life or property.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED THAT:

- **1.01 Authorized Use:** Permittee is hereby granted a nonexclusive right to communicate on DNR's FCC-licensed radio channels where such communication is necessary to assist the DNR in emergency situations involving imminent safety to life or property. Usage shall be limited to the following activities: Fire Suppression, Safety or Mutual Aid.
- **2.01 Contacts:** The authorized contacts are as follows:

- **3.01** Equipment: Usage is further limited to N/A mobile and N/A portable radios.
- **4.01 Channels:** Permittee is authorized to use the following DNR channels and frequencies:

Note: All channels are narrowband.

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- **5.01 Duration:** Subject to its other provisions, the period of performance of this Agreement shall commence on March 14, 2016 and be completed on March 14, 2022 unless terminated sooner as provided in this Agreement, or extended through a properly executed amendment.
- **6.01** Radio Procedures: Permittee shall be required to observe the following procedures:
 - 1. Do not transmit if the channel is already in use, and yield to emergency or urgent or priority (fire and urgent law enforcement) radio traffic.
 - 2. Announce the FCC call sign (KE9669), and the name of Permittee and personal identifier from the DNR region radio operators and incident dispatchers.
 - 3. Take direction from the DNR region radio operators and incident dispatchers.
 - 4. Allow only trained users to talk on DNR channels.
- **7.01 Training:** Users of DNR radio frequencies must attend formal training session on radio procedures to ensure proper operation. Radio user training is a requirement to this Permit. At a minimum, until training can be scheduled and conducted, radio users shall read the DNR radio training manual and review the DNR training video titled "Radio Procedures".
- **8.01** Assignability: This Permit, and any claim arising under the Permit, is not assignable or delegable by the Permittee either in whole or in part.
- **9.01 Independent Capacity:** The Permittee and its employees or agents performing under the Permit are not employees or agents of the DNR.
- **10.01 Termination:** This Permit may be terminated by the DNR by oral or written notice to Permittee of a breach of any requirement herein. This Permit may be terminated for convenience by DNR by giving Permittee written notice at the address noted below at least ten (10) days before date of effective terminations.
- **11.01 Indemnification:** The parties each agree to defend, protect, save and hold harmless each other, their officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, costs, damages and expenses suffered by the other party due to the actions of a party, its agents or employees under this Permit.
- **12.01 Entire Agreement:** This document contains all covenants, stipulations and provisions agreed by both parties. No agent or representative of either party has the authority to make, and the parties shall not be bound by or be liable for, any statement, representation, promise or agreement not set forth herein. No changes, amendments or modification of the terms hereof shall be valid unless reduced in writing and signed by the parties as an amendment to this Permit.

13.01 Severability: If any provision of this Agreement or any provision of any document incorporated by reference shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this Permit which can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of the Permit are declared to be severable.
